Construction of classroom and administration buildings should be completed by December



the multipurpose building is in place and the structural steel framing is filling the skyline.

In October, modernization of the school's existing buildings will go out for bid, with construction expected to begin in January 2003. Five interim housing classrooms have been placed on the lower campus to provide temporary classroom facilities during modernization work which will progress in phases. The new classroom and administration buildings will be occupied and operating by the time modernization begins.

The modernization work will include new finishes to classrooms and restrooms. All buildings will have the electrical, data, telecommunications, intercom, fire and security alarm systems upgraded. In the gymnasium, the locker and shower facilities will be expanded and completely renovated. Disabled access will be provided throughout the campus with the redesign and construction of walkways and ramps.

When students departed in June, the foundations for the classroom and administration buildings had been poured. Now the walls are up, windows are going in and the power will be turned on next month. That's progress!

Ralph Larsen & Son, Inc. of Belmont, the general contractor for the project, expects to complete construction on these two buildings in December - two months ahead of schedule. The central quad area and the stairway connecting the upper and lower campuses are also complete. The pathways and gathering areas that will further enhance the cohesiveness of the campus are still in progress.
